





Holocaust Documentation Centre in Jerusalem

The International School For Holocaust Studies (ISHS) in Yad Vashem in Jerusalem has offered Maximilian-Kolbe-Gymnasium (MKG) in Cologne / Germany the opportunity to organize a video conference with witnesses of the Third Reich.

- The focus of the project is the question of whether it is useful to interview people who lived through the Third Reich, even over long distances.
- The situation in this type of interview is a special one as the interviewer and the person being interviewed do not know each other and have to communicate through a medium over long distances.
- If a video conference can be organized and held successfully, this medium can be used to provide a new global frame for interviews with experts.



When the Prime Minister of the German state NRW (= North Rhine Westphalia), Dr. Jürgen Rüttgers, paid a state visit to Israel on 11.06.08, he agreed on expanding school projects between Germany and Israel.





20 teachers from NRW participated in this state visit.




Our interview partner and witness of the Third Reich during our video conference on 29.10.08 – Naftali Fürst











Basic biographical dates of Naftali Fürst

- 18.12.1932 birth of Naftali Fürst in Bratislava
- end of 1938 after the Munich Treaty (Münchner Abkommen) his family was forced to leave their home
- March 1942 deportation of his relatives to death camps
- 09.05.1942 his family decides to go "voluntarily" to the work camp Sered
- 25.08.1944 escape from Sered and arrest through the Gestapo
- 02.11.1944 transport to the camp in Auschwitz-Birkenau
- 20.01.1945 death march / transport to Buchenwald
- 11.04.1945 liberation through American soldiers
- 26.04.1945 return to Bratislava / his family survived
- 23.02.1949 emigration to Israel
- 20.04.1949 his parents and brother follow Naftali to Israel
- 11.04.2004 visit to the concentration camp Buchenwald



The different stages in Naftali Fürst's life are being analysed in different groups.




Jasmin, Marcella and Simone deal with Naftali Fürst's expulsion from his family home



David and Marco study the situation at the end of World War II. Janine and Ornella focus on Naftali Fürst's emigration to Israel.




Kathrin and Janina work on his struggle to survive in the concentration camp.





The time for questions was clearly extended. Nevertheless, the dialogue between Naftali Fürst and Dr. Mkayton in the second stage of the interview is important to familiarize the students with the witness. This stage should, however, not have been extended any further as the students might have become impatient.

Expectations:

I would like to ...

- learn more than the things written in our history textbooks
- learn to understand feelings and different perceptions
- have an immediate personal contact
- find out how a video conference works

Experiences:

I have ...

- got first-hand information
- gained insight into the perspective of an immediate witness
- had a personal contact
- learned to appreciate the medium of a video conference

Video conference on 29.10.2008 – Open issues

Two topics were too complicated to be discussed fully and to have come to a satisfactory conclusion:

- the special situation of an infant-survivor (perception of the culprits, perception of the hierarchy among the prisoners etc.)
- the ethical question: a different judgement of the moral behaviour of the victims, e.g. the clear distinction in the motivation of moral or amoral behaviour.

Video conference on 29.10.2008 – Experiences and insights

- 1. The witness of the Third Reich and the group of students need to be informed about the project and its aims in due time.
- 2. The video conference technique needs to meet international standards and must be tested beforehand.
- 3. The interview partners need a plan with the different stages of the interview.
- 4. The group of students needs to learn about the biography of the witness.
- 5. The questions to the witness need to be elaborated from the biography and structured with the help of a mind map. Before that it has to be clear which questions should be asked and which ones should out of principle not be asked.
- 6. The witness and the students need the help and support of a video conference coordinator.
- 7. Before the conference basic general rules on how to speak and how to behave during the interview should be established.
- 8. The different stages of the interview should contain an equal amount of presentations and questions.

Video conference on 29.10.2008 – Our conclusions:

- The interview with a witness of the Third Reich over a long distance was an important and useful project and a great personal experience for the students.
- In spite of the technical particularities, this form of interview enables a communication over screen and microphone which seems as if the interview partners were talking face to face.
- A video conference still is, even at university, an exclusive project. Careful preparations are vital to its success, otherwise, this means of communication cannot be used globally for interviews with experts.

Diversity Day, a FRA Youth event to promote diversity among young people in Europe, 10 November 2008 [10-10-2008]

Diversity Day, a FRA project piloted in 2007 aimed at promoting understanding for principles of equality among young people in Europe, will take place this year on 10 November in Vienna.
